What is a Braille notetaker?

A braille notetaker is an all-in-one device comprising of a refreshable braille display, a braille keyboard and built-in software for writing and communication.

What is a Braille notetaker used for?

Braille notetakers support people with severe sight loss or blindness to take notes, write emails or documents, navigate the Internet, read books and organise information independently.

Key Features of a Braille notetaker:

- Refreshable tactile braille cells
- Braille keyboard for text input
- Wi-Fi and Bluetooth connectivity
- Built-in apps such as email and web browser
- Internal storage for documents and books
